Stories with Familiar Settings

- Read and listen to a selection of stories with events and settings that will be familiar to them.
- Read and discuss the story 'Funnybones'.
- Identify characters, settings and main events.

Non-fiction

Labels, lists and captions

- Identify where we use labels, lists and captions.
- Write and use labels, lists and captions.

Listening Comprehension

- The children will listen to and discuss a range of stories including traditional tales and topic based stories. They will be encouraged to answer questions and record their answers.

Phonics

- Develop their knowledge of phonics through the Letters and Sounds sessions.
- Work on spelling and simple grammar activities (punctuation and sentence construction).

Art

- Recognise and draw lines of different sizes and thicknesses.
- To show patterns and texture by using dots, lines and zig-zags.
- To experiment with shading and mark making.
- Use thick and thin paintbrushes.
- Mix primary colours to make secondary colours.
- Make tints and tones by adding white and black paint.
- Draw lines and patterns to draw faces/self-portraits.
- Look at famous artists and use some of their techniques in their own work.

History

- To ask questions to find out information about people/events in the past.
- Discuss how they change as they get older and examine what they can do now and what they did as babies/toddlers.
- Order pictures/events on a timeline and add dates.
- Look at the toys we have now and compare them with the toys that children played with in the past.
- Look at the similarities and difference between toys now and toys in the past.

Computing

- To login safely. To start to introduce to the children the idea of 'ownership' of their creative work.
- To know how to find saved work in the Online Work area and find teacher comments. To know how to search Purple Mash to find resources
- To start to add pictures and text to work.
- To sort items on the computer using the 'Grouping' activities in Purple Mash.

PE

- To develop gymnastic skills in travelling, balancing, jumping and co-ordination.
- Develop ability to follow instructions and to work safely in a given space.

Science

- Identify the basic parts of the human body.
- Name and label external and internal parts of the body.
- Find out which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- Explore growth in humans from babies to adults.
- Learn that humans produce offspring.

RE

- To explore questions about who made the world
- To explore the idea that created things have creators.
- To look at objects in the natural world.
- Explore the story of creation.
- To find out about Harvest.

Maths

- To work with numbers from 0 -20.
- Position numbers on a number line.
- Count sets of objects.
- Represent objects and numbers.
- Count forwards and backwards.
- Find one more/less than a given number.
- Compare and order numbers
- Use part and whole models.
- Recognise and use addition symbol.
- Number bonds to 10 and fact families.
- Subtraction by crossing out.
- Recognise and use the subtraction symbol.
- Subtraction by counting back.
- Finding the difference.
- Fact families using addition and subtraction.
- To name and describe 2D and 3D shapes using the correct mathematical vocabulary.
- Creating and completing patterns using 2D and 3D shapes

- To explain their classroom rules and be able to contribute to making these.
- To explore their own feelings and those of others.
- To recognize that feelings can be hurt and feelings can make us behave in different ways.
- To recognize that they belong to various groups and communities such as their family

Music

- Listen to music and find the pulse.
- Identify instruments and voices when listening to music.
- Find the pulse by marching.
- Clap rhythms.
- Rap and sing songs.
- Play tuned instruments using two notes.
- Improvise using clapping and singing
- Compose a simple melody.
- Perform using rapping, singing and playing.
